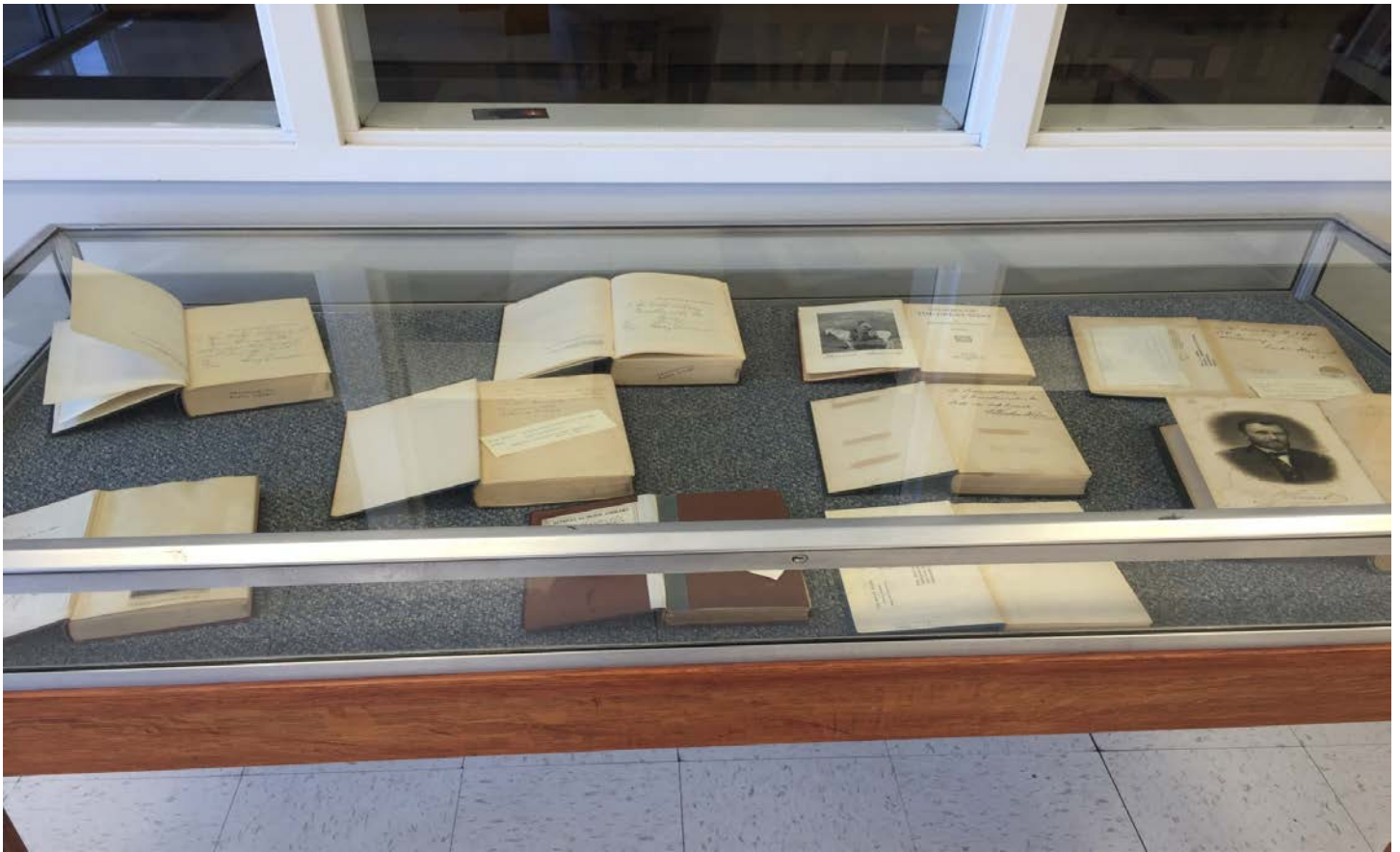
"Coming Home: Two Artists, Two Perspectives, One Hometown" continues at the Caruthersville Armory through May 10th.

HISTORICAL FINDS AT CARUTHERSVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY

We recently unearthed some wonderful historic treasures here at the library. Mrs. Zula Fowlkes, the city's first official librarian, received books from various Presidents of the United States to commemorate special events at the library. The book pictured above at the top right is from President Franklin D. Roosevelt on the occasion of the library's 10th anniversary in 1933. The book was accompanied by a letter on White House stationery addressed to Mrs. Fowlkes. There are several other amazing books signed by Herbert Hoover, Woodrow Wilson, Harry S Truman, and William Jennings Bryan, to name a few. Located in the Lobby display case.

Paint a Picture

If you add pictures to other parts of your newsletter and want to match the cool, two-part border on the photo you see at the top of each page, just paint it!
