Public Library Card Sign Up at Schools

Caruthersville Public Library and Caruthersville Public School District are partnering to help make city library cards available to all students.

There are currently two options – eCard only, which students may sign up for themselves by simply signing the application picked up at school, which only permits the child to use the eResources – eBooks, eVideos, eAudios, and online databases – and the Classic library card, which allows the students to have all benefits of the Caruthersville Public Library – checking out books, audiobooks, and DVDs, as well as being able to take part in our programming and movies on Sundays. For this card, a parent must bring the application in to the library and sign it at the circulation desk as being responsible for the student.

We hope to see many new patrons at Caruthersville Public Library from the school!




