Aug. 21, 2017 will be the first total eclipse of the sun to visit Missouri in 148 years

For the first time since Aug. 7, 1869 (That's 148 years!) a total solar eclipse will come to Missouri, and, weather permitting, the next one will be even better than the last one. The 1869 eclipse only clipped the northeast corner of our state. The 2017 eclipse will begin its sweep from the northwest corner to Cape Girardeau. Depending upon where you are in the state, the eclipse will begin between 11:30 a.m. and noon. It will continue until between 2:30 p.m. and 3 p.m. Even the parts of Missouri farthest from the path will experience a partial eclipse in which over 92% of the sun is covered and even that will be spectacular!

At Caruthersville Public Library, we will be hosting an Eclipse Viewing Lunch in our back yard from 11:00-1:30 on August 21st. Bring your lawn chair or blanket and a sack lunch and enjoy a clear and unobstructed view of the sky.

We will even provide free eclipse glasses for you and your family, which are available now at the Circulation desk.

"Pushing the Limits" is new fall program for adults - Introduction on Aug. 15th at 6:00

Caruthersville Public Library will be presenting the three-part program series, *Pushing the Limits*. The programs encourage adults in your community to consider their own resiliency and adaptation strategies in the face of climate change and severe weather events.

Each public program is organized around a different theme – change, community, and strategy. The themes will be explored in program discussions (facilitated our science partner from the National Weather Service - Weather Forecast Office in Memphis, Gary Woodall) and will be based on a recommended reading of popular fiction or historical nonfiction and the viewing of a short (7-10 minutes) feature-film quality video produced specifically for the project. Each video is what one might call, "real people, real stories, real science," and provides a look at an individual or family using scientific ideas, principles, or technologies to push limits in their own lives when faced with extreme weather events. The stories presented in these videos have been chosen for their general appeal. For each program, a book has been selected by our library that connects to the program theme.

All participants will receive a free copy of each of the three books used for this programming for their own reading and analysis.
